Frequently asked questions for September.

Do I need to stick to my pick up and drop off times?

Yes, these are to ensure we can keep everyone socially distanced and to make sure entrances, corridors and exits are clear.

What if my time slot doesn't suit my working pattern?

If this is the case, please give us a ring and we'll see if we can rearrange your time to either earlier or later.

Can I come in to school with my child?

Unfortunately not. All children will need to come in to the school buildings on their own. There will be signs on doors, so you know which door your child needs to use.

What if I need to go to the office?

The main office door will be open and staff will be on hand to answer any questions you have, but wherever possible we are asking all parents to give the office a ring, rather than enter the building.

Can my child come to school on their own?

No, all children will need to be dropped off and picked up by a parent/carer. This is to ensure they socially distance on the way to and from school.

Can a friend pick up or drop my child off?

At the moment, the person dropping off and picking up needs to be from the same household. If this isn't possible you can nominate one other person, but please let the office know who that is and we'll update our records.

Does my child need to wear school uniform?

Yes, we've made the decision that if children wear school uniform they can change in to non-uniform as soon as they are home. <u>Uniform must be changed as soon as children are home.</u>
Uniform in Nursery is optional.

Price increase.

From September we will be increasing our wraparound care by 50p each session. This will mean that from September the prices each day will be:

Breakfast club £1.50

After school club $3.30-5.00 \, \pounds 3.50$ and $3.30-6.00 \, \pounds 4.50$

Nursery lunchtime cover £2.50

Nursery breakfast club £5.00

Nursery after school club 3.30-5.00 £6.50 and 3.30-6.00 £9.50

Please note Nursery wrap around is different to main school, due to the amount of staff needed for Nursery aged pupils.

All wraparound care and dinner money must be in credit. Please ensure your parent pay account is topped up before booking any additional items.
