

Early Years Foundation Stage

#### Physical Development (PE)

Control and coordination practise to measure and pour to make pancakes. Developing pincer grip to pinch seeds to pick them up for planting; we will be planting cress seeds, pea plants, bean plants and sunflowers. Whole body movements to move in different ways during PE; moving like a butterfly, caterpillar, ladybird. Developing pencil grip and control to write ingredients lists for pancake day, and the names of different minibeasts. Using knives to chop herbs and scissors to

#### Understanding of the World

Growing cress seeds in egg shells left over from pancake day.

Grow pea plants, bean stalks and sunflowers. Exploring and learning through our 5 senses.

Celebrating Easter and learning about the Easter story.

#### **Mathematics**

Length of different worms

Nursery: Counting objects accurately, recognising and ordering numbers to 5, beginning to work with numbers beyond 5.

Reception: subitising numbers, recognising and ordering numbers to 10, counting accurately and recognising numbers beyond 10.

Writing shopping lists for pancake day, labelling the parts of a plant and writing our bug hunt lists.

## Expressive Arts and Design (Art, D&T and Music)

Explore colour mixing through mixing primary colours together. When colour have you made? Which fruit from our story does this match? Let's use the colour to create a painting of this part of the book. Encourage children to draw the shape of the food first and then paint it.
