Castle View Primary School and Nursery – Why complete PE?

Why have we decided to move to Complete PE?		
Needs based	 As a school we do not currently have an effective and progressive PE scheme built upon the knowledge and skills of physical education. Children struggle to express their thoughts about PE and are sport driven rather than skill driven. We also currently have insufficient equipment needed to effectively teach and model Primary PE. 	
Evidence informed	 Pupil voice makes it apparent children are heavily sport driven and not cognitively thinking about what they are learning. Evidence has been sought from staff surveys to measure confidence in delivering PE. This will inform individualised CPD moving forwards 	
Proactive	 Previous schemes have been removed and online progression documents and curriculum put in place (streamlined) Video CPD stimulus is provided per session to visually show/model the activities. Initial staff meeting conducting to introduce the scheme and re-visits planned into the diary to support. These will be little and often and conducted by the subject leader. 	

What are we going to do about it?	How will we measure impact?
 Introduce a progressive scheme of learning built upon the principles of the skills and knowledge of PE Initial PD session to introduce and understand the scheme Drop-in sessions to discuss what is working and any support needed (this will happen 3 times per unit initially) Learning walks to celebrate good practice and to look for potential areas for improvement Learning walks will inform future PD sessions. 	 Key unit questions will be confidently and articulately answered during pupil voice Pupil voice will show an increased knowledge in the skills of PE Pupil voice will show an increase in cognitive thinking during PE sessions Staff confidence audits will be more positive when re-visited. Learning walks will show strong modelling and questioning throughout sessions. Learning walks with demonstrate children cognitively thinking throughout sessions.
